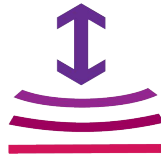

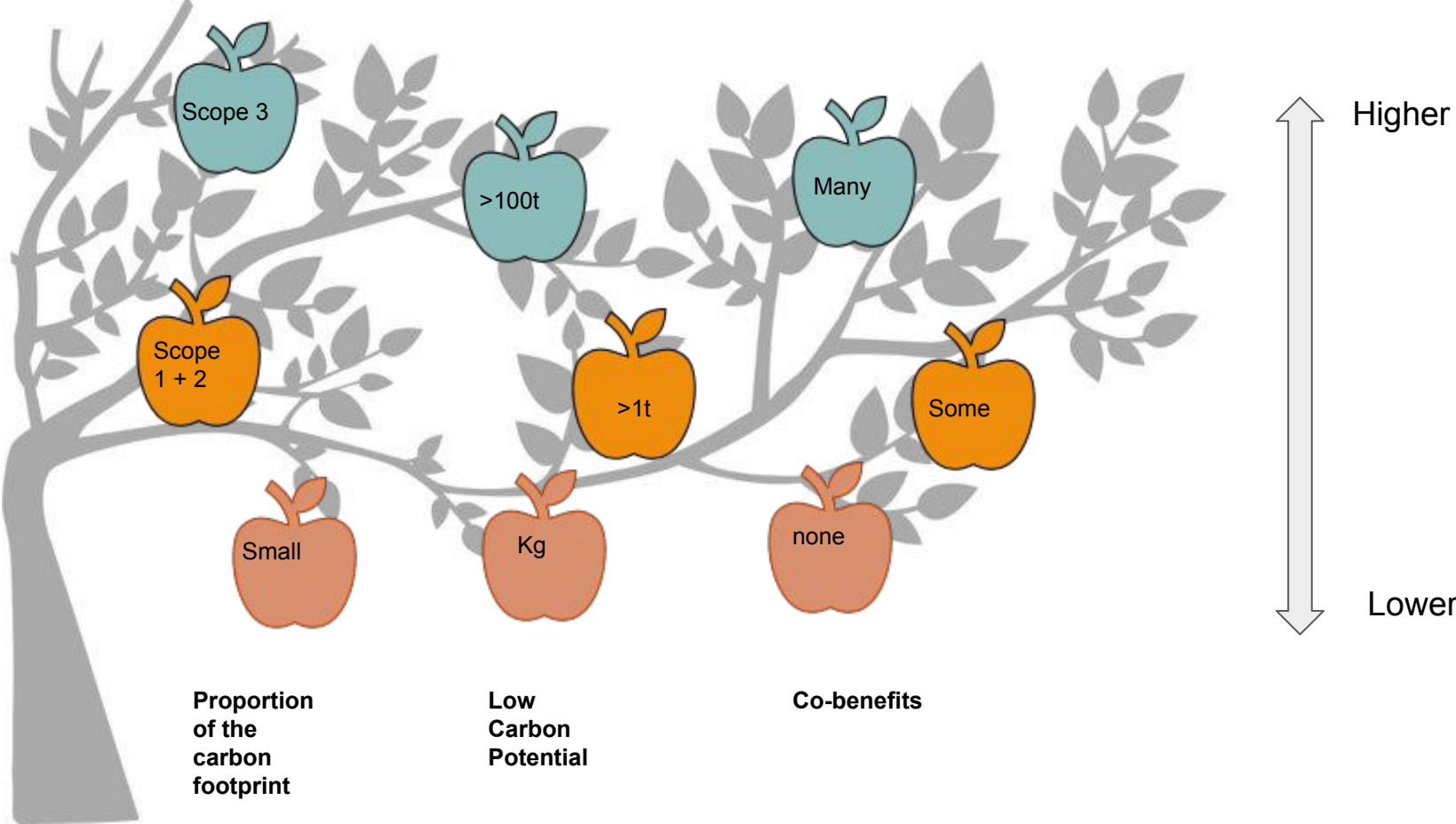

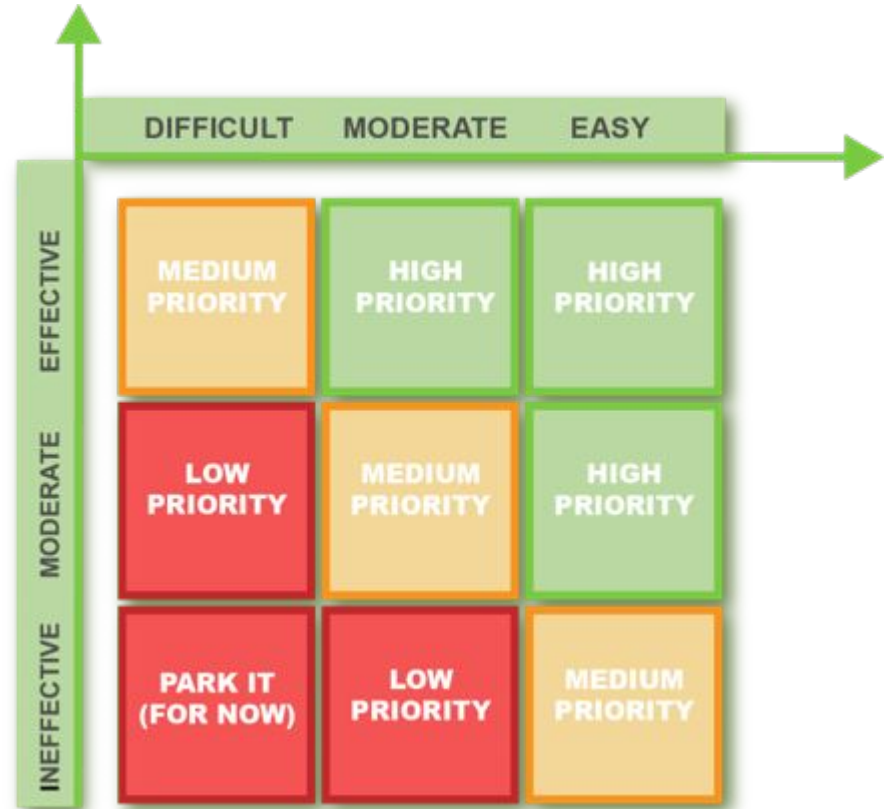
Prioritising Action
